







3 Museum Brandhorst

Theresienstraße 35a

The Brandhorst Collection comprises more than 1200 works by pioneering artists of the 20th and 21st centuries, such as Cy Twombly, Andy Warhol, Nicole Eisenman, Louise Lawler and Wolfgang Tillmans. Selected works from the collection are presented on the ground floor of the museum. Parallel to this, changing special exhibitions are staged.

Adjacent to the Museum Brandhorst are the remaining ruins of the Turkish barracks from 1826. Inside is a surprising object: a 25-ton granite sphere in shining red the installation “Large Red Sphere” by the American artist Walter De Maria.





4 Spielzeugmuseum

Marienplatz 15

The Spielzeugmuseum is located in the tower of the Altes Rathaus directly on Marienplatz. With its rustic tower rooms, it is itself reminiscent of a doll house. It is pure nostalgia: dolls, soft toys, model railways and tin toys which go back more than 200 years are lovingly presented on more than four floors.



It is not that easy to spot it! It is sitting on the roof of the building between the Spielzeugmuseum and St.Peters-Kirche. As early as medieval Munich, figures of cats on the roof ridge were symbols of happiness and wealth and helped to prevent the building from being damaged.



5 Museum Villa Stuck

Prinzregentenstraße 60

Franz von Stuck's (1863 – 1928) villa was designed as a synthesis of the arts. Today its historical rooms accommodate a municipal museum. Traveling exhibitions of the 19th and 20th centuries as well as contemporary art are also on display.

6 Lenbachhaus

Luisenstraße 33

The Städtische Galerie in Lenbachhaus has a unique collection about the 'Blue Rider' artist group. In addition to artworks from the 19th century, the museum also exhibits art from the period after 1945.

7 Staatliches Museum Ägyptischer Kunst

8 NS-Dokumentationszentrum München

Brienner Straße 34

With the NS Documentation Center, opened in spring 2015, Munich has received a central place of learning and remembrance about the dark history of National Socialism. In addition to a permanent exhibition, the museum features a multimedia learning facility, special exhibitions as well as a diverse educational and event program.



Geschwister-Scholl-Platz 1

The DenkStätte Weiße Rose is located in the atrium of the Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität Munich, close to the historical place where the resistance fighters Hans and Sophie Scholl were arrested on February 18, 1943.

Barberinischer Faun

In 1813, King Ludwig I bought the figure from the Roman Barberini family. This work of art was created around 220 BC and depicts a satyr. The sculptor has breathed life into the stone: You can literally feel the blood pulsing under the surface of the skin of the lasciviously sprawled man.

9 Glyptothek

Königsplatz 3

The pillared portico of the oldest Munich museum, opened in 1830, is reminiscent of a Greek temple. Its interior accommodates the originals of renowned antique sculptures including the ‘Medusa Rondanini’ and the ‘Barberini Faun’.

11 Archäologische Staatsammlung München (ASM)

Lerchenfeldstr. 2

The ASM is the central Bavarian state museum for pre-history and early history. It researches and presents finds from the pre-history of Bavaria to modern times- this is where archaeology comes to life. Its branch museums explain the history of human development in the respective region. (Re-opening 2023/24)

The Deutsches Museum ranks among the greatest museums of technology and natural sciences in the world. In addition to historical originals it also presents models for experimenting. Natural laws, instruments and technical procedures are explained in a hands-on manner.

The world's first automobile Carl Benz patented the first petrol-driven car in 1886. The original three-wheeled vehicle is on display in the Deutsches Museum Verkehrszentrum (transport museum). The four-stroke engine had an output of 0.88 hp.

Prinzregentenstraße 3

Works of European art and culture from the early Middle Ages to Art Nouveau, including sculptures, paintings and handicrafts. The manger collection featuring figurines from Naples, Sicily and the alpine region is world-famous.
